

BSC Entry Level Award in Workplace Hazard Awareness

A free qualification for schools and colleges

A young person is seriously injured in a UK workplace every 40 minutes. In the last decade, 66-under 19s have been killed at work.

As part of its charitable mission, the British Safety Council is paying for all 14-19 year olds in full-time education in the UK to gain a nationally-recognised qualification in health and safety.

The BSC Entry Level Award in Workplace Hazard Awareness is completely free to all schools and colleges in the UK.

How it works


- Register now by telephoning BSC Examinations on 020 8600 1034 or e-mailing schools@britsafe.org
- Prepare your students for the assessment using free learning materials supplied by the Institution of Occupational Safety and Health (IOSH) and the Health and Safety Executive (HSE)
- Students complete the assessment by collating a simple portfolio of evidence. The BSC provides structured evidence sheets to help students meet the assessment requirements
- Submit marks followed by a moderation sample
- Receive confirmation of results and qualification certificates
