## Overview

The Level 1 Certificate in Health and Safety at Work aims to formalise health and safety induction training in the form of a nationally-recognised qualification. Accredited by the Qualifications and Curriculum Authority (QCA) at Level 1 in the National Qualifications Framework.

- A syllabus based on the national occupational standards which covers the basics of health and safety in the workplace.

## How it works

- Organisations register with BSC Awards  
BSC Members £250 + VAT  
Non-Members £350 + VAT
- BSC Awards supplies photocopiable student handouts, PowerPoint slides and lesson plans.
- Organisations prepare candidates for the assessment. The syllabus can be delivered as a 1-day course.
- Organisations order a 40-question multiple-choice examination from BSC Awards.
- Candidates sit the examination in-company, invigilated by the company under strict examination conditions.
- Answer forms returned to BSC Awards for marking.
- Results and certificates issued within five days.
- Annual renewal fee of £100.
