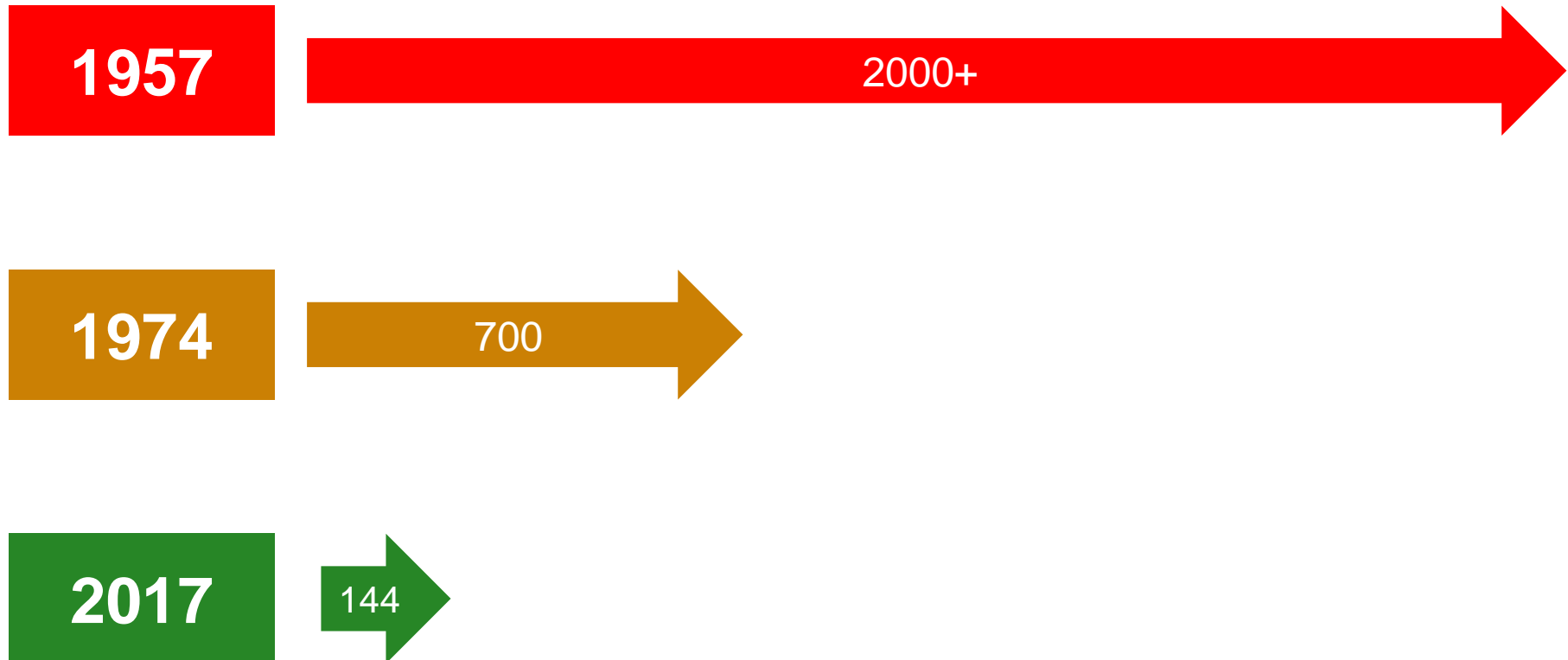

UK – Number of Fatal Work Accidents



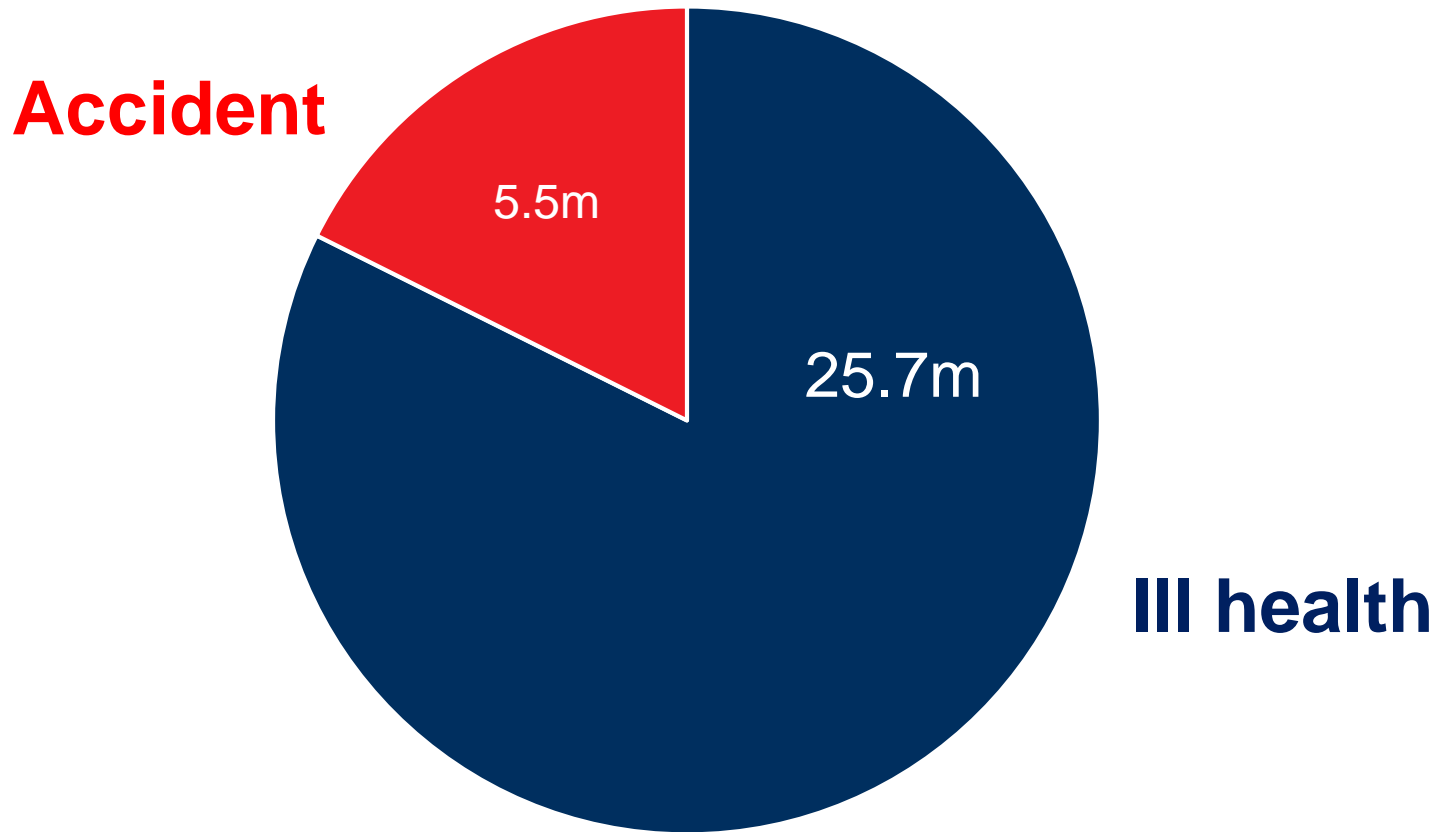
86% reduction over the last forty years

Work related ill-health Annual Number of Deaths

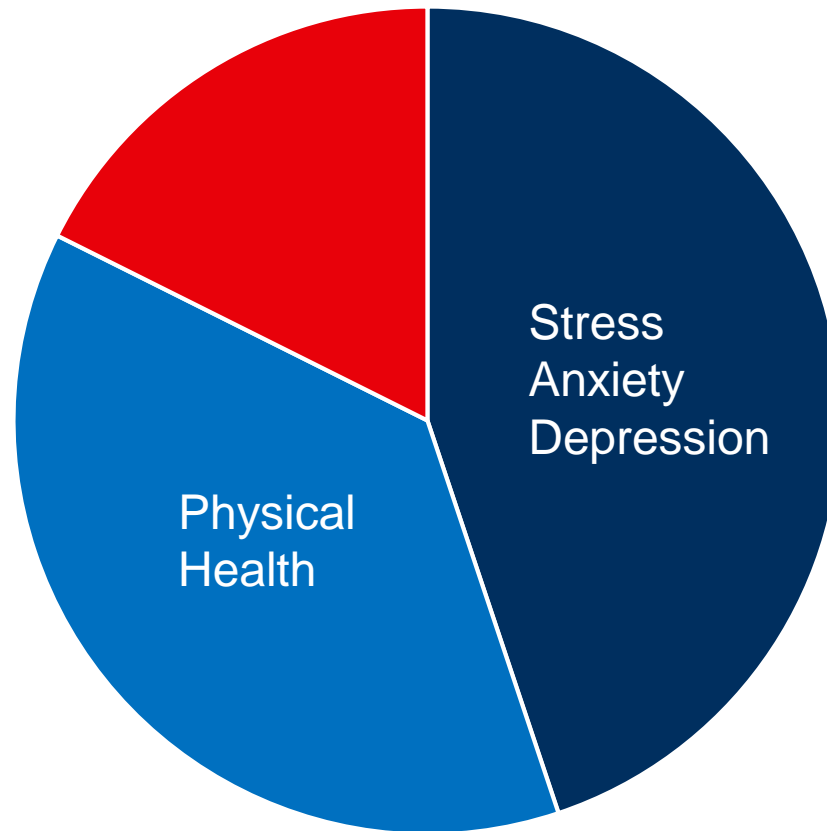

Links between Health & Safety



- Poor mental health increases the risk of accidents at work
- Employees suffering from fatigue are 2.9x more likely to be involved in a job-related workplace accident
- Overweight and obese manufacturing workers are 25% to 68% more likely to experience injuries than normal weight workers
