The British Safety Council Partnership Programme is a new way for you to support, and shape, our social impact work while engaging with emerging issues, research, and best practices across workplace health, safety and wellbeing.

Through this partnership we are creating a community of trusted organisations who share our mission that no-one is injured or made ill through their work. We aim to build long-term relationships with our partners who will help us grow, scale and shape our work.

About our first-year social impact projects: Hidden Hazards

Hidden Hazards is British Safety Council's new flagship campaign. It is a UK-wide awareness campaign designed to shine light on the leading causes of work-related harm, which are too often, out of sight and out of mind.

Through Hidden Hazards, we will raise awareness of overlooked occupational health risks, provide practical support to employees, and use evidence to influence improvements in workplace practice and public policy.

This is an ongoing campaign delivered through six-month thematic phases, each focusing on a different hidden occupational hazard.

The first four topics are:

1. Refined crystalline silica (RCS) dust and Silicosis
2. Psychosocial strain
3. Asbestos, and
4. Air Quality.



About our first-year social impact projects: Open Access Research

As workplaces evolve, robust research is essential to identify emerging risks and inform effective health and safety practice.

British Safety Council conducts and shares evidence-based research to shape policy, improve workplace standards, and support better decision-making across industries.

By making our findings publicly available, we help drive positive change across the wider Occupational Health and Safety community.



About our first-year social impact projects: From Service to Safety

The UK faces a growing shortage of qualified Occupational Health & Safety (OHS) professionals, while many veterans and service leavers struggle to transition into civilian employment.

From Safety to Service, launched by British Safety Council in partnership with NEBOSH, helps address both challenges by providing veterans with NEBOSH National General Certificate training and a pathway into sustainable employment.

The programme:

- Tackles the UK's OHS skills shortage
- Harnesses veterans' transferable skills in risk identification, management and leadership
- Brings greater diversity into the profession
- Supports successful long-term career transitions.

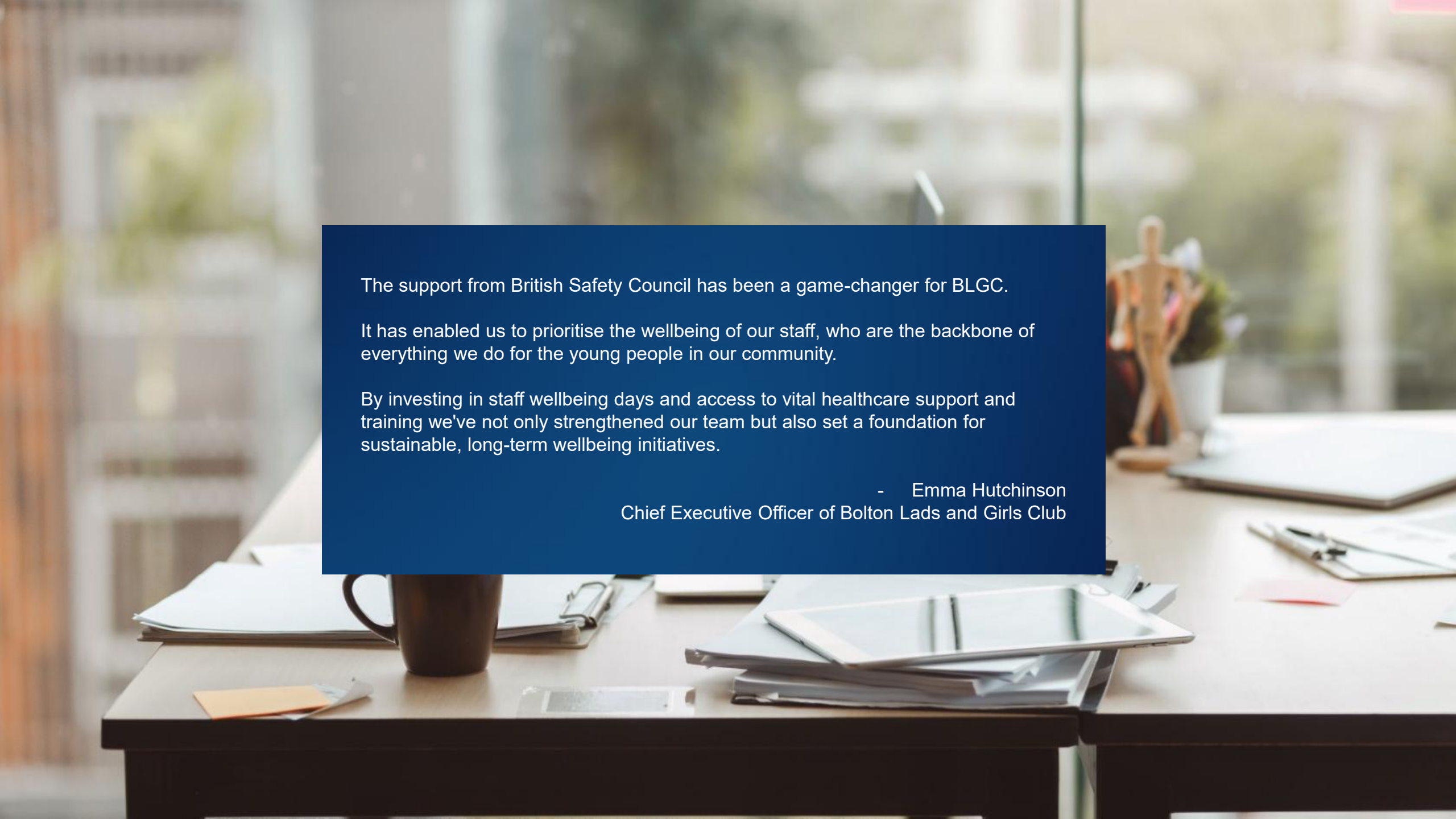
About our first-year social impact projects: Workplace Wellbeing
